WHAT IS MUSICAL CONNECTIONS?

Musical Connections is a network for isolated, marginalised &/or vulnerable adults, running for over 25 years. Many members are, or have been, mental health service users, with others having long-term health conditions, physical disabilities or sensory impairments affecting their mental health, mental & physical health being intrinsically linked.

We understand the impact on mental health that coronavirus has had & appreciate that, for some, ongoing challenges, grief & social anxieties may remain. We aim for Musical Connections to help rebuild your confidence, using music to help you to express your feelings & to connect you with others with similar interests & experiences. Our current recruitment for Musical Connections is aimed at those who would struggle to access mainstream opportunities or our social prescribing group sessions, as Musical Connections offers one-to-one support to build confidence & skills to then support progression to collaborative sessions.

Musical Connections takes on 12 new members per year for creative music making, offering:

- 10 x individual creative music making sessions working with an allocated professional musician, helping you to create an original song or music track
- · The chance to record the track you create for a compilation CD/online playlist
- · Regular newsletters & the opportunity to take part in the wider Musical Connections offer:
- O Monthly group songwriting sessions, to connect with other participants
- O Weekly small group activities, each term of 10 weeks focused on a different musical theme
- O Performance opportunities & social events
- O An opportunity to apply for a weekend residential (*limited places priority to new members)

No previous musical experience is needed, just a willingness to have a go & take part...after all, anyone can have a brilliant musical idea! If you are already a proficient musician, that's fine too!

Musical Connections sessions run from our space at the Afro Caribbean Millennium Centre, 339 Dudley Road, Birmingham, B18 4HB. On request we can run one-to-one sessions on Zoom but always aim to progress to face-to-face provision to better build social connections. All group sessions are now in person, so applicants must be able to travel to Winson Green.
